

CACC's Story

- Established in Fall 2016 as a counseling local pathway action team within our Career Pathways Trust (CPT) grant
 - Chabot & four feeder districts that were part of CPT
 - Design & growth supported by coaching from CLP (thank you to Lupe Dannels & Luis Chavez!)
- Institutionalized as part of Chabot's Counseling Department in 2019 (Thanks to our Dean at that time)
 - Co-leadership with other Chabot K-12 focused programs and people
- We captured our work in 2019 with the "executive summary"
- Kept going online during the pandemic
 - Our district marketing hired a consultant firm to study what influences students' decision making- no surprise that HS counselors were highlighted....Now we have our institution's attention :-)
- In Fall 2022 we returned to in person convenings and monthly online and in person meetings (alternating)

Many Fall 2024 courses are offered online (Location in schedule listed as "CTBA Online"). Courses included on this list are those that meet after traditional school hours (3 pm) or are online asynchronous and that do not require a prerequisite course. Check the online Fall 2024 Class Schedule for a complete list of courses offered in Fall 2024.

- **In-person:** In-person meet up times. This list will only list In-person for classes that are in the evenings or weekends.
- **Asynchronous (Async):** students log in any time (listed as "TBA" for the Time).
- **Synchronous (Sync):** students log in at the days/times listed in schedule (Days and times listed).
- **Hybrid:** Mix of In-person and synchronous online courses.
- **Online:** Virtual, modality is TBA.
- **Note:** Other courses not on this list may be taken except for Physical Education (PE) or basic skills courses.




