Southwestern College | DE Equity Plan

- CCAP & Dual Enrollment Advisory Group formed in December 2021
 - Objectives: Increase pathways, participation, and close equity gaps
- Identified disproportionately impacted populations & capture rates
- Identified challenges and barriers, brainstormed solutions, draft equity action plan
 - Increase staffing (Peers, Classified, and Director)
 - Pilots with lowest capture rates & higher number of Black/African American students
 - Middle College at San Ysidro
 - Embedded in SEAP: Community Engagement Plan, MATH, AA History
 - Need for technology and High Touch Support










Riverside City College | Dual Enrollment






- We found RCC CCAP numbers do not reflect the number of Latinx and African American HS students in our service area
 - Latinx: -11%; Black/AfAm: -1-3%
 - Black/AfAm & Latinx have lowest success rates
- CLP Community of Practice
 - Provides an opportunity to directly address
 AfAm and Latinx student access and success
 - Openly reviewing and sharing data
 - Helps the conversation move beyond onboarding challenges
 - Creates a community of open dialogue, sharing new approaches, decreases isolation











Dual Enrollment Funding Opportunities

Funding Opportunities

- 200m dual enrollment
 - 100m for for CCAP expansion (100k ea)
 - 100m for Early or Middle College High School (250k ea)
- 500m Golden State Pathways
 - Partnerships secondary, post-secondary, employers, CBOs etc.
 - Priority pathways- Education, Healthcare, Technology, and STEM/Climate Related Fields
 - Integrated college *and* career
 - 12 units of early college credit
 - Work-based learning
 - Quality standards like Linked Learning



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Dual Enrollment Opportunities

- \$100m for College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) \$100k awards
 - New CCAP agreements
 - Expand to serve more students w/in a school or expand to a new high school in a district
 - Expand to include robust pupil advising, student success support services, and outreach campaigns to promote dual enrollment.
- \$100m for Middle Colleges and Early Colleges (MCEC) \$250k awards
 - New MCECs either autonomous
 - Expand MCECs to serve more students
 - Expand to include robust pupil advising, student success support services, and outreach campaigns to promote dual enrollment.



Dual Enrollment Grants Timeline

- February 16 RFA Released √
- March 30 Applications Due
- June Grantees Announced
- July 1 Project Term Begins
- September Disbursement of Funds
- June 30, 2027 All Funds Must be Dispersed

- Program Capacity

Non-Allowable

- Supplanting existing services
- Equipment for Admin
- Purchase/Lease/Remodel of furniture or facilities
- High School Textbooks
- Journal/Periodical subscriptions

 - LEA must submit a separate application for each high school

Priority

- LEAs with higher than average:
 - Dropout rate
 - Rate of suspension and expulsion
 - Rates of homelessness, foster youth, or justiceinvolved youth.
- LEAs with lower than average:
 - A-G completion rate
- LEAs with at least fifty percent of students are unduplicated (English learners, economically disadvantaged, foster youth)
